4-H AFTERSCHOOL

4--H Afterschool programs meet each school day at the Cochrane-Fountain City School or the Mondovi Community Youth Center. The programs are designed to provide academic enrichment and life skill development for youth in grades K-6 under the leadership of youth protection certified college students and volunteers. Youth enrolled in 4-H Afterschool receive the same benefits and opportunities as members in traditional 4-H clubs.

4-H COMMUNITY CLUBS

Twelve community 4-H clubs are active across Buffalo County. Each club is open to youth in grades K-13. 4-H Community clubs meet traditionally once a month to participate in business meetings, social activities and learning experiences centered on 4-H project work. Youth and adults work in partnership to provide leadership for 4-H community clubs to ensure they are welcoming and engaging for all members.



4-H SCIENCE

Buffalo County 4-H offers opportunities to engage in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) learning activities aimed at increasing youth critical thinking and 21st century problem solving skills through inquiry-based programming.
